Big Changes in the Paperwork!

Mrs. Feistner has set up data merges for much of the forms. If any data is incorrect, PLEASE correct it ON THE FORM. Accuracy is key. You fix it first, then she'll fix the database & next year's merge has less errors. And won't THAT be nice.

Mission Statement:

After School Care (ASC) exists to provide a safe, supervised place where Mt. Olive students can go after school to wait for their ride home or wait for band lessons, sports practices, or other after school activities to begin. This program will give students a chance for physical activity, study and social interaction in a Christian environment.

Fees:

After School Care will operate each complete school day from 2:30 until 5:15 pm. There is no ASC when school is dismissed early.

There will not be any before school care. School doors open at 7:45AM.

This program is funded totally through user fees, and is not part of the congregational budget. The fees are as follows:

Annual family registration fee = \$10

Registered child rate

= \$3.00 per hour

Drop – in child rate

= \$3.50 per hour

Late fee – after 5:15

= \$.50 per minute

- Charges are billed by the quarter hour to closely reflect time used.
- Billing will be done through the FACTS system.

Participation requirements:

To participate in the After-School Care Program:

- 1. The child must be a student of Mt. Olive Lutheran School.
- 2. An enrollment form must be completed and signed for each family intending to use After School Care either regularly or occasionally.
- 3. Fees must be paid promptly and in full.
- 4. Students must follow all ASC rules and guidelines, and they must cooperate and obey the ASC staff.
- Toys, outside food (except for students with food allergies) and electronic devices such as cell phones, I-pods etc. will not be allowed. These items should be given to the After School Care Coordinator and will be returned to the child at the end of their day.

If you are interested in using ASC regularly or occasionally, please complete the ASC enrollment form.


