Week 3 (9/25)

Matthew 19:14

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these."

THE FIFTH COMMANDMENT

What does this mean? We should fear and love God, so that we do no bodily harm to our neighbor, but help and befriend him in every need.

THE SIXTH COMMANDMENT

You shall not commit adultery.

Take My Life and Let It Be (ELH 444)- vs 1-6

2. Take my hands and let them move At the impulse of Thy love. Take my feet and let them be Swift and beautiful for Thee.
3. Take my voice and let me sing Always only, for my King. Take my lips and let them be Filled with messages from Thee.
4. Take my silver and my gold, Not a mite would I with hold. Take my intellect and use Ev'ry pow'r as Thou shalt choose.
5. Take my will and make it Thine; It shall be no longer mine. Take my heart, it is Thine own; It shall be Thy royal throne.
6. Take my love, my Lord, I pour At Thy feet its treasure store; Take myself, and I will be Ever, only, all for Thee.

Week 4 (10/2)

Ephesians 2:8-9

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— not by works, so that no one can boast.

THE SEVENTH COMMANDMENT

You shall not steal.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God, so that we do not take our neighbor's money or goods, nor get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his goods and means of making a living.

THE EIGHTH COMMANDMENT

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God, so that we do not lie about, betray or slander our neighbor, but excuse him, speak well of him, and put the best construction on everything.

Hark! The Voice of Jesus Crying (ELH 191)- vs 1-4

1. Hark! The voice of Jesus crying, "Who will go and work today? Fields are ripe and harvests waiting; who will bear the sheaves away?" Loud and long the Master calleth; Rich reward He offers thee. Who will answer, gladly saying, "Here am I, send me, send me?"

2. If you cannot speak like angels, If you cannot preach like Paul, You can tell the love of Jesus; You can say He died for all. If you cannot rouse the wicked With the Judgment's dread alarms, You can lead the little children To the Savior's waiting arms.

3. If you cannot be a watchman, Standing high on Zion's wall, Pointing out the path to heaven, Off'ring life and peace to all, With your prayers and with your off'rings You can do what God demands; You can be like faithful Aaron, Holding up the prophet's hands.

4. Let none hear you idly saying, "There is nothing I can do," While the multitudes are dying, And the Master calls for you. Take the task He gives you gladly; Let His work your pleasure be. Answer quickly when He calleth, "Here am I, send me, send me!"

Week 5 (10/9)

2 Timothy 3:16-17

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

THE NINTH COMMANDMENT

You shall not covet your neighbor's house.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God, so that we do not craftily seek to gain our neighbor's inheritance or home, nor get it by a show of right, but help and serve him in keeping it.

THE TENTH COMMANDMENT

You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his cattle, nor anything that is his.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God, so that we do not tempt, force or coax away from our neighbor his wife or his workers, but urge them to stay and do their duty.

Fear and Love Thy God and Lord (510)

1 Fear and love thy God and Lord, And revere His name and Word, Holy keep the Sabbath day, Honor to thy parents pay. Kill not, shun adultery, Steal not, lies and slander flee, Keep from covetousness free. Help me, Lord, I trust in Thee!

2 In the Father I believe, Who to all did being give, And in Jesus Christ, His Son, Who for all redemption won; And my faith I also place In the Holy Ghost, whose grace Sanctifies our souls and ways. Grant me faith through all my days!

3 Father, throned in heav'n above, Hallowed by Thy name in love; Let Thy kingdom come, we pray, And Thy will be done alway; Give us food, forgiveness send, In temptations aid extend, Save us, Lord, when comes our end! Amen! Lord, Thy Church defend!

4 God the Father, God the Son, God the Spirit, Three in One, I, baptized into Thy name, As Thy child Thy blessing claim; Grant that by Thy promised grace I my trust in Thee may place, All my sins with peace replace Till in heav'n I see Thy face.

Week 6 (*10/16)

Hast thou not seen How thy desires all have been
Granted in what He ordaineth?
4. Praise to the Lord, who doth prosper thy work and defend thee,
Who from the heavens the streams of His mercy doth send thee.
Ponder a new What the Almighty can do
Who with His love doth befriend thee.
5. Praise to the Lord! O let all that is in me adore Him!
All that hath life and breath, come now with praises before him!

Week 9 (11/6)

THE SECOND ARTICLE

THE THIRD PETITION

Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.

What does this mean?

The good and gracious will of God is certainly done without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may be done also among us.

How is God's will done?

God's will is done when He breaks and hinders every evil counsel and will which would not let us hallow His name nor let His kingdom come, such as the will of the devil, the world and our own flesh; but strengthens and keeps us steadfast in His Word and in faith until our end. This is His good and gracious will.

O That the Lord Would Guide My Ways (ELH 441)- vs 1-4

1. O that the Lord would guide my ways To keep His statutes still!

O that my God would grant me grace To know and do His will!

What is Confession?

What sins should we confess?

Before God we should acknowledge ourselves guilty of all sins, even of those which we do not know about, as we do in the Lord's Prayer. But before the pastor or confessor we should acknowledge those sins only which we know and feel in our hearts.

Which are these?

Here consider your own situation according to the Ten Commandments, whether you are a father, mother, son, daughter, employer, employee; whether you have been disobedient, dishonest, lazy; whether you have injured anyone by word or deed; whether you have stolen, neglected, wasted anything, or done any harm.

John 8: 31-32

Jesus said, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

THE NATURE OF THE SACRAMENT OF THE ALTAR

What is the Sacrament of the Altar?

The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ himself, for us Christians to eat and to drink.

Where is this written?

The holy evangelists Matthew, Mark and Luke, together with St. Paul, write thus: "Our Lord Jesus Christ, the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples, saying, 'Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me.' In the same way also He took the cup after supper, gave thanks and gave it to them, saying, Drink from it, all of you; this cup is the New Testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the remission of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

Let Us Ever Walk With Jesus (ELH 236)- vs 1-4

THE BENEFIT OF THE SACRAMENT OF THE ALTAR

What benefit do we receive from such eating and drinking?

The benefit which we receive from such eating and drinking is shown us by these words: "Given and shed for you for the remission of sins," namely, that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life and salvation are given us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation.

THE POWER OF THE SACRAMENT OF THE ALTAR

How can bodily eating and drinking do such great things?

It is not the eating and drinking that does this, but the words here written: "Given and shed for you for the remission of sins." These words, along with the eating and drinking, are the main thing in the Sacrament; and whoever believes these words has exactly what they say, namely, the forgiveness of sins.

THE PROPER RECEPTION OF THE SACRAMENT OF THE ALTAR

Who then receives this Sacrament worthily?

Fasting and bodily preparation are indeed a fine outward training; but he is truly worthy and well prepared who has faith in these words, "Given and shed for you for the remission of sins." But he who does not believe these words, or doubts them, is unworthy and unprepared; for the words "for you" require truly believing hearts.

We Now Implore God, the Holy Ghost (ELH 33)- vs 1-3
